
TWENTY-THIRD SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME – SEPTEMBER 08, 2024

In the haunts where jackals once lay, grass and reeds and papyrus will grow.


R. Praise the Lord, my soul!



GOSPEL – Mark 7:31-37

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Mark

³¹ Then Jesus left the vicinity of Tyre and went through Sidon, down to the Sea of Galilee and into the region of the Decapolis.

³² There some people brought to him a man who was deaf and could hardly talk, and they begged Jesus to place his hand on him.

³³ After he took him aside, away from the crowd, Jesus put his fingers into the man's ears. Then he spit and touched the man's tongue. ³⁴ He looked up to heaven and with a deep sigh said to him, *"Ephphatha!"* (which means "Be opened!"). ³⁵ At this, the man's ears were opened, his tongue was loosened and he began to speak plainly.

³⁶ Jesus commanded them not to tell anyone. But the more he did so, the more they kept talking about it. ³⁷ People were overwhelmed with amazement. "He has done everything well," they said. "He even makes the deaf hear and the mute speak."

Dear God,

When I see a wrong attitude or behavior in other people, I always have the choice of how I will react. All too often, I respond with criticism or judgment. I find myself criticizing or lecturing the other person without any intent to see them improve or succeed. In the process, I hurt their feelings and I usually drive them away. But, Lord, I know that this is not your way! You call on me to carefully look at my own behavior before I express an opinion about that of someone else. Please help me learn this important first step to responding with an attitude of love and humility. Only with that mindset will I be able to offer constructive criticism – where my goal is to build a strong, positive relationship, and to help the other person become who you created them to be. Guard my heart and my lips, keeping me from harsh judgment and hurtful words. Remind me to always let love be my guide.
